General District Information

Trail of the Lakes Municipal Utility District (the "District") is a Texas local governmental entity that provides water and sanitary sewer service to Atascocita Forest, The Forest, The Park at Atascocita Forest, Clayton's Park and Clayton's Park East subdivisions. The District was created on April 26, 1974, by the Texas Water Rights Commission. The District is located 17 miles northeast of downtown Houston and 3.5 miles southeast of Humble, Texas. The District is governed by a five-member Board of Directors who regularly meet the last Monday of each month at 12:00 p.m. at the offices of Radcliffe Adams Barner PLLC, 2929 Allen Parkway, Suite 3450, Houston, Texas 77019. WATER CONSERVATION TIPS



Water conservation remains an important priority for all Texans. Below are some helpful indoor water conservation tips to use water more efficiently and reduce your water bill.

In the Kitchen:

- Run the dishwasher only when full. If your machine has a quick wash or light duty setting, use it!
- Dry scrape dishes instead of rinsing before loading. Your dishwasher will take care of the rest.
- Use garbage disposals sparingly.

In the Laundry room:

- Wash only full loads.
- Use the lowest water level setting on the washing machine for light or partial loads whenever possible.
- Conventional washing machines can use up to twice as much water per load compared to high-efficiency machines.

In the Bathroom:

- Install a water-efficient showerhead. Turn off the tap while shaving. Fill the sink with an inch of hot water instead of letting it run continuously.
- Never use the toilet to dispose of trash.
- Don't run the water while brushing your teeth or washing your hands. Shut off the water until it's time to rinse.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

Here are some safety tips to help reduce your risk of becoming a target for crime this Summer:

Parking lot safety

- Lock your doors when getting in or out of your car.
- Inspect the area around and inside your car before getting in.
- Park in well-lit areas at night.
- Ask for an escort if you feel unsafe walking to your car.
- Place your valuables and packages in the trunk of your car; keep them out of sight.

Self-protection tips

- Do not walk along parking lots or streets without looking around for potential danger.
- Stop frequently and observe your surroundings.
- Carry a sound-making device and small flashlight.
- Give the appearance that you are alert. Keep your head up and look around. Attackers often target those distracted or unaware.

Home and car protection

- Keep your home and car locked at all times.
- Never leave your vehicle unattended with keys in the ignition.
- Be sure to activate car and home alarms.
- Use a timer for interior and exterior lights.
- Suspend mail and newspaper delivery when going out of town.
- Sign up for Vacation Watch with the Harris County Constable's Office, Precinct No. 4 (the "Constable") on its website at constablepct4.com.
- Avoid posting your out-of-town holiday plans on social media sites.
